## Discussion Guide Week 3

Last time we discussed why the world isn't a loving place like God intended. We spent time in deeper reflection on the story to learn more about God's love. Have someone share a quick recap of your previous discussion.

### Discuss

This is a continuation of last week's discussion on Jesus' core message to the world. Here are some questions to guide your discussion:



1. The aftermath of humanity's actions has affected everything—how we see ourselves, our relationships, and even our relationship with God. In your opinion, what would it take to restore or heal everything that has been broken through humanity's selfishness?

*Christian worldview: God knew that it was humanly impossible to heal all the pain and evil in the world. So God entered our mess, took on our humanity and rewrote our story through Jesus. In every way that humanity was selfish, Jesus was selfless. Jesus took on himself the cost and consequences of humanity's actions - our actions, and it killed him. It took divinity to carry all the brokenness of humanity. Jesus came back to life and overcame death itself! Because of Jesus, our relationship with God can be restored and we can experience true life. The image on the left represents that we are made worthy in God's eyes not because of what we have done, but because of what Jesus did for us.*

2. Share with each other:  
If you consider yourself a follower of Jesus, what has it meant for you to experience life because of Jesus? What has changed in you by knowing your sense of identity and worth is in Jesus?

If you don't consider yourself a follower of Jesus, what do you think of this idea—that God deeply loves us and wants us to know life through Jesus? What would change if you experienced the love of Jesus, love that isn't based on your actions or "worthiness," but because of what Jesus has already done?




*Christian worldview: This is the core message that Jesus was telling the world, so that humanity could know life and freedom: that we are loved not because of what we do, but because of what God has done for us. The image on the left represents that this is good news worth sharing! We are invited to think about who in our lives might need to hear this good news for themselves and to go and share with those very friends.*

3. Who do you know that might need to hear this good news for themselves?


## Activity: Spiritual Survey


**TRUST** *I try to value all people, but I usually don't trust Christians. I still feel a little skeptical about the whole thing.*




**CURIOUS** *I love learning how others experience faith. I want to press into my curiosity about Jesus rather than dismiss my questions.*




**OPEN** *I'm open to trying something new. I want to experience God for myself.*
